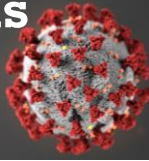

Veterans Day is November 11

Veterans Day, observed each year on November 11, is a tribute to military veterans who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. It honors all military veterans.

First commemorated as Armistice Day, it was observed in honor of the fallen soldiers of the Great (First World) War for their sacrifice and bravery. In 1926, Congress adopted a resolution for President Coolidge to issue annual proclamations of November 11, making Armistice Day a legal holiday. In 1954, Congress amended the Act of 1938 and changed the name of the holiday to Veterans Day from Armistice Day. With this change, Veterans Day recognized American veterans of all wars.

United States Senate Resolution 143, passed in 2001, designated the week of November 11 through November 17 as National Veterans Awareness Week. The resolution calls for educational efforts directed at elementary and secondary school students concerning the contributions and sacrifices of veterans.

Region 8 wishes to take this opportunity to thank veterans for their dedication and service to the United States of America.

Wednesday, **November 11**, is a federal and state holiday. The Region 8 offices will be closed to commemorate this special date. If you have a public health emergency, please call **210-949-2121**. The **Coronavirus Update** will not be published.

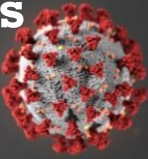
